Anthony Tyrone Carter Jr., 25, passed away on November 1, 2025, after a sudden and severe illness. While his symptoms first appeared flu-like, doctors later found he had an invasive Group A Streptococcus infection that progressed to toxic shock syndrome and multi-organ failure. His loss was unexpected, and he leaves his family and friends deeply heartbroken. Born on December 31, 1999, in Hartford, Connecticut, Anthony brought a vibrant spirit and a light that filled every room he entered. He graduated from Ardrey Kell High School in 2018 and went on to attend Saint Augustine's University and the University of North Carolina at Charlotte. He built a career in moving and logistics with WayForth and Hornet Moving, earning a reputation for reliability, positivity, and a tireless work ethic. From the age of eight, Anthony found joy on the football field and devoted many seasons to the game he loved. His laughter was bright and contagious—upbeat, warm, and sure to bring a smile to those around him. He loved to dance and approached life with enthusiasm, creativity, and a generous heart. He treasured taking his daughter, Chanel (4), to the park and cherished every moment they shared. Music was his great passion. Producing under the name ACBeats, Anthony poured countless late nights into crafting melodies and percussion, layering sounds, and refining every detail until a track “felt right.” He taught himself the craft, built a simple home setup, and loved sharing works-in-progress with friends and family, always open to collaboration and eager to learn. In recent years he also found joy in boxing, running, and skateboarding. Anthony leaves behind his beloved

daughter, Chanel Carter (mother, Emily Haworth); his parents, Anthony Carter Sr. and Sonya Carter; and his sisters, Shaina (Nathan) Travis and Summer Carter. He is also survived by his grandparents—Lorraine James, John Russell (Paula), and Anthony McCann; his aunts, Sharnice (Hampton) Watson and Shavon Russell and Taloria Wilson; and his uncle, Manny Belabe. He will be dearly missed by his niece and nephew, CJ and Charli Travis; and by many loving cousins, including Sage Frederich and Aiden Vega; Evan, Sasha, and Sanai Belabe; Nova, Nori, Harlyn, and Hampton Watson IV; and Mark Anthony Vance Wilson III.
