James (Bo) Bolling Davis Jr.

Mr. Davis, 84, of Charlotte passed away on November 27, 2013 at his home following a 2-year battle with acute myeloid leukemia.

He was born on May 31, 1929, in Petersburg, Virginia. He was preceded in death by his parents, James Bolling Davis and Minnie Eley Davis, his wife Betty Bennett Davis and his sister Drucille Davis Ellis.

After receiving his master's degree from the University of Virginia and serving two years in the U.S. Army, he spent his entire professional career in the Charlotte-Mecklenburg School System.

Before retiring, he served as a teacher, counselor, elementary and secondary school principal, secondary personnel administrator and a director of federal programs in the system's junior high schools.

He is survived by daughters Jane Davis Hayse and husband Fred Hayse of Woodstock, GA, Susan Davis and friend Dru DeVan of Charlotte and his long time partner, Henry Coddington. Also surviving him is brother-in-law Arthur Ellis, Sr., nephew Arthur Ellis, Jr. and wife, Wanda, brother-in-law Tom Bennett and wife Jean, nephew Kip Bennett and wife Peggy, niece Elizabeth Bennett;
