His greatest joy was spending quality time with his son giving fatherly advice. One of Robert's favorite past times was attending Taylors, athletic events. Robert and his little brother Joe Camp had a loving inseparable relationship where he too looked to him for brotherly advice. His stepfather, Joe Graham, played an influential role in teaching Robert to play sports. Joe loved Robert very much.
